

Diversity in education and cultural institutions workshops at the Emigration Museum in Gdynia / 24.04.2026

This free one-day workshop is dedicated to theoretical and practical approaches to diversity in schools and cultural institutions. It invites participants to reflect on the opportunities and challenges of working with diversity, as well as their own experiences in education and curatorial work.

Participants will have the opportunity to learn about current concepts and practices, exchange experiences with people with different professional perspectives and gain inspiration for implementing strategies that promote diversity in their communities.

Workshops are aimed at **educators** and **curators of cultural institutions** (particularly museums), **school teachers** and **members of migrant communities** interested in diversity in education and culture. They offer an open space for dialogue, shared learning, and mutual inspiration.
